Go Green with E-Statements

Everyone who logs into Virtual Branch Internet Banking should get their statements online. It's more secure, quicker, and convenient. Plus, it's the "Go Green" thing to do. Switching to online statements versus paper will help the environment and your credit union by reducing paper and fuel consumption, costly production and postage expense each month.

With e-Statements in Virtual Branch:

- You will improve security and the handling of your personal information stop collecting stacks of paper and worrying your information will be lost or stolen.
- Your statements will be ready to view earlier than the paper version.
- You have nothing new to learn it looks just like the paper statement you've been getting and can be printed.
- You'll have up to 12-months' statement history to view from anywhere there's an Internet connection.
- You'll enjoy the convenience of another popular service to manage your money online.

We work hard to protect your debit card from fraud.

For some time now, PFCU and Shazam have been working together to protect your debit card from fraud. In the past, you may have received a phone call from a Shazam Fraud Specialist to verify one of your transactions. Currently, those phone calls are made after the transaction has already occurred, in hopes of halting further fraudulent transactions.

In the near future, we will enhance this service to begin monitoring debit card transactions as they occur and declining those with the greatest likelihood of fraud. We believe that this will provide a new and valuable layer of protection to your account.

In the future, if your debit card is declined at a merchant location, one of the reasons may be that it was flagged as highly likely to be fraud, based on the way you typically use your card. If your transaction is declined for that reason, you will receive a phone call from a Shazam Fraud Specialist to verify the transaction. If it was a legitimate transaction, the details will be made part of your card profile so that these types of transactions have a greater chance of being approved in the future.

PFCU values the trust you have placed with us, and we will continue to look for new ways to protect your
